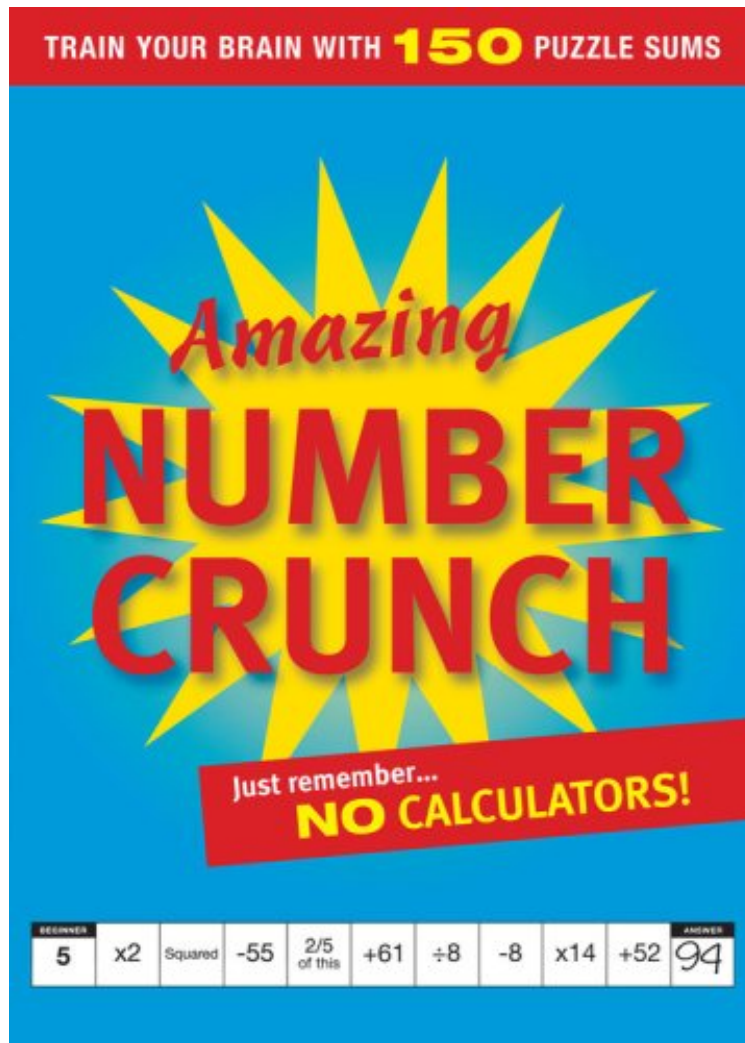

Each puzzle has a beginner, intermediate and advanced version so really you're getting three times the amount of puzzles that are advertised. If you blow up the image of the cover you'll see a sample puzzle at the bottom of the cover. That gives you a good idea of what the book is like. I haven't been using pencil and paper.
