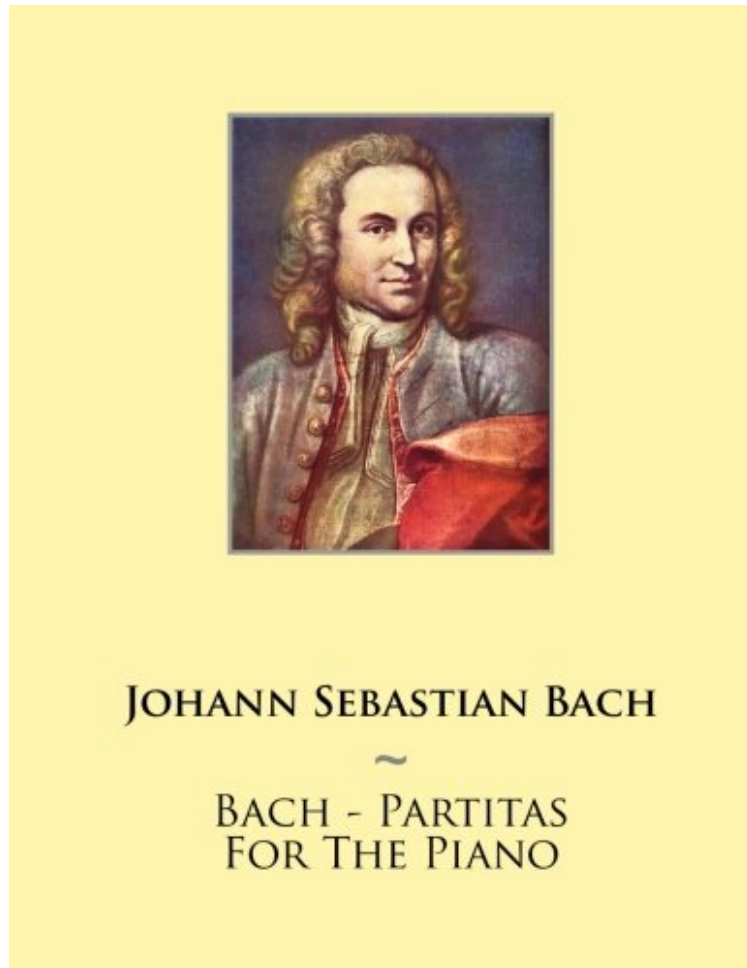

I do not think you can find a better buy for the quality of printing which is what ...By CGIsacksonThis book contains all six of Bach's Partitas. Very few books have such a clear print of the notes. The 16th and 32nd notes have extremely well defined notations instead of dark bars that do not show the individual two or three separate bars separately (instead of just a wide dark single bar). However septuplets in the fifth measure of the 6th partita are not marked. I have found no tuplets with indicators, so beware of that issue. There is also no preface or table of contents and no discussion about the partitas. Partita I starts right off as the first printed page under the cover. - just a few notes that may not rub you the right way - There is fingering, however. But for pure sight reading and practicing of the pieces, I do not think you can find a better buy for the quality of printing which is what I was looking for, so I was very pleased with this book.
