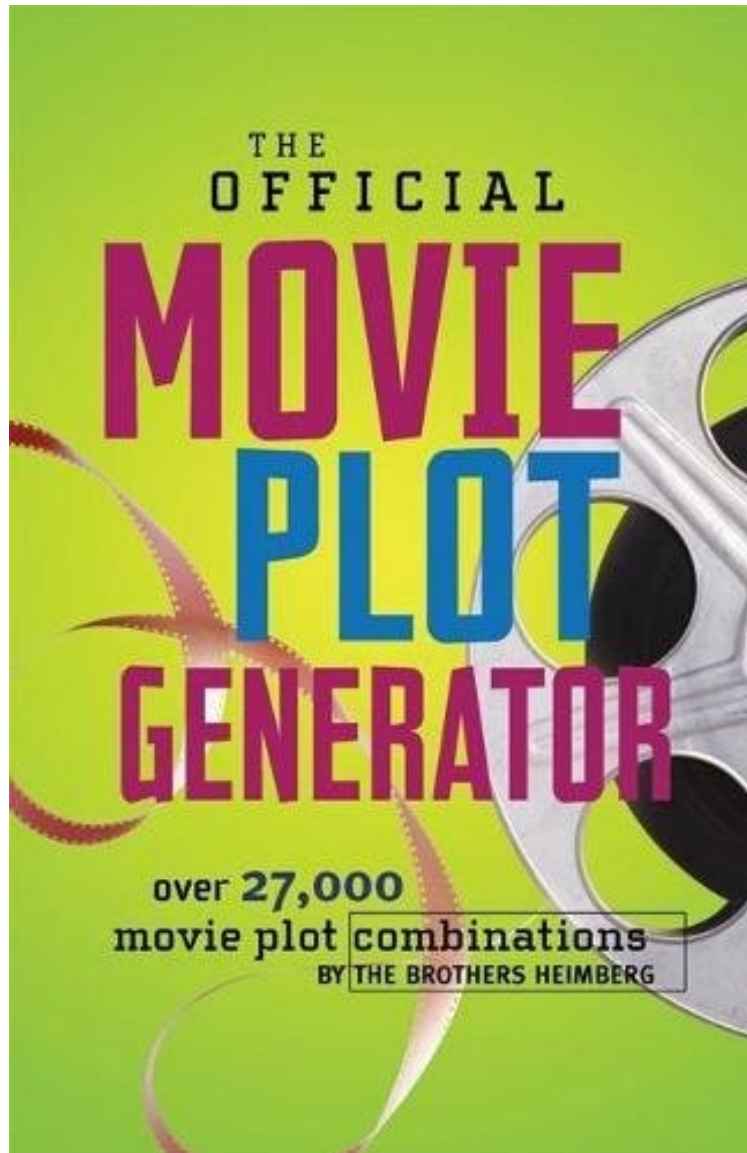

is clever and funny, but not as good as I'd hoped as a plotting reference for writers. If you're writing preposterous sci-fi and fantasy, you may find enough writing prompts to make this a must-own. (For me, the *The Amazing Story Generator: Creates Thousands of Writing Prompts* is far better, but it also constructs simple, three-step plot ideas. You'd need a lot more to fill in a book, but for a short story, it may be enough.) As a funny book to own, the *Movie Plot Generator* is amusing. It would probably get lots of laughs at parties, too. Just keep in mind that the book is cut into three sections: A series of pages describing a possible protagonist (or antagonist), like "America's Founding Fathers." The middle section gives you the basic story concept, like "Hit(s) the Karaoke Circuit." The lower section (of three) provides the closing, marketing-type blurb, like "in this powerful After-School Special." Okay, that was chosen at random. Some combinations are funnier than others. So, if you're buying this for entertainment, I think it could be a four-star product. Maybe even five. If you're a writer looking for story prompts, and your sense of humor is zany, this may also be a worthwhile purchase. For me, it was worth buying, just to see the silliness. And, I am going to keep it around for amusement. (Besides, it may eventually turn out to be a great writing tool.) It's a clever idea. I like it, but if you're serious about writing screenplays, I think it's more fun than functional.
