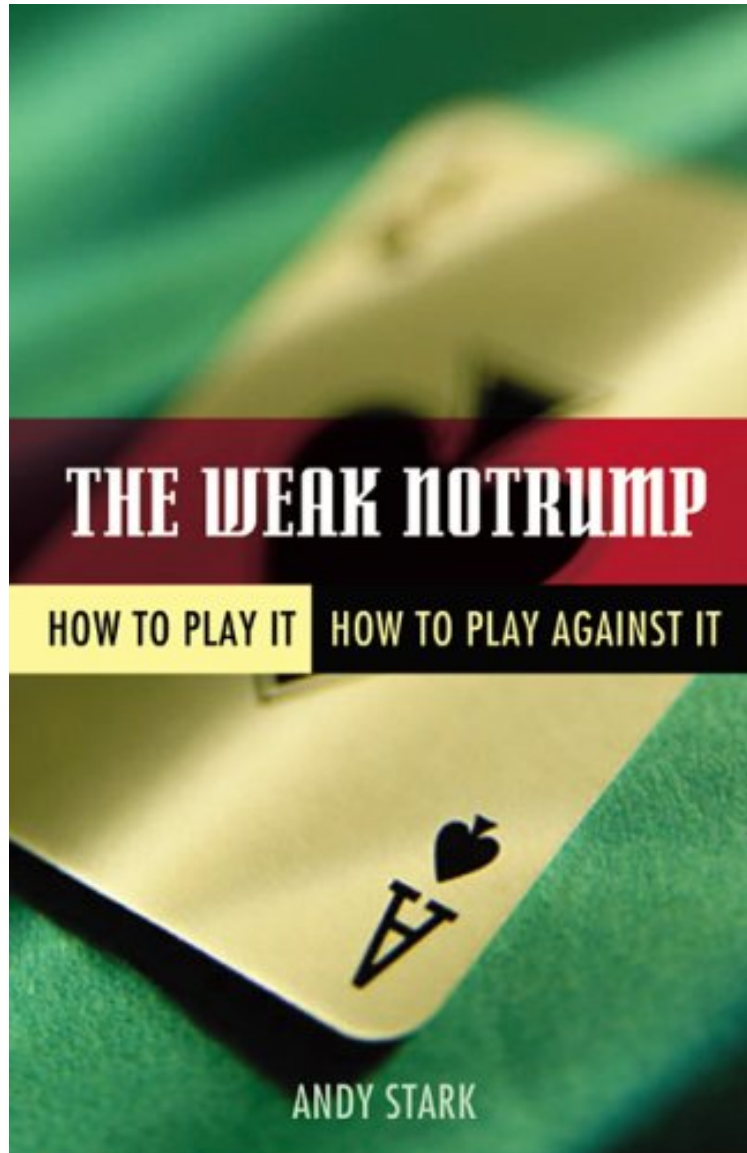

HAMsmokeI have been playing a weak NT for many, many years under a K-S framework. I have recently shifted to a more modern 2/1 style, but still incorporate a weak NT. This book provides many ideas and alternative treatments (such as transfers vs. two way Stayman). I have but one question, or complaint. Maybe it is only in the Kindle edition, but there are some treatments or suggestions made, but then the entire method is omitted! For example, in the section discussing how to handle a 3 level preempt over partner's 1/1 bid, the text says to try this scheme: And then no scheme is offered! This occurs a few times throughout the book. If it is only on the Kindle edition, this needs to be looked at and fixed. If the print edition is like this as well, then shame on the editors. I feel that the book is better for players that already have some familiarity with a weak NT system as they can better understand the situations the author is describing. Not that anything is really over the top, although I do not suggest this title for beginners or advanced beginners.

All North American players are taught to play using a strong notrump, but that is not the way of the rest of the world. Even in North America, weak notrump systems, or even Kamikaze notrump systems, are becoming more common. This book discusses the advantages and disadvantages of playing a system with a weaker notrump opening, and shows how the 1NT range impacts the rest of the bidding system. Even those who have no interest in converting to a weak notrump range still need to know how to play against weak notrump systems. For them, the book includes advice on effective competitive methods.
