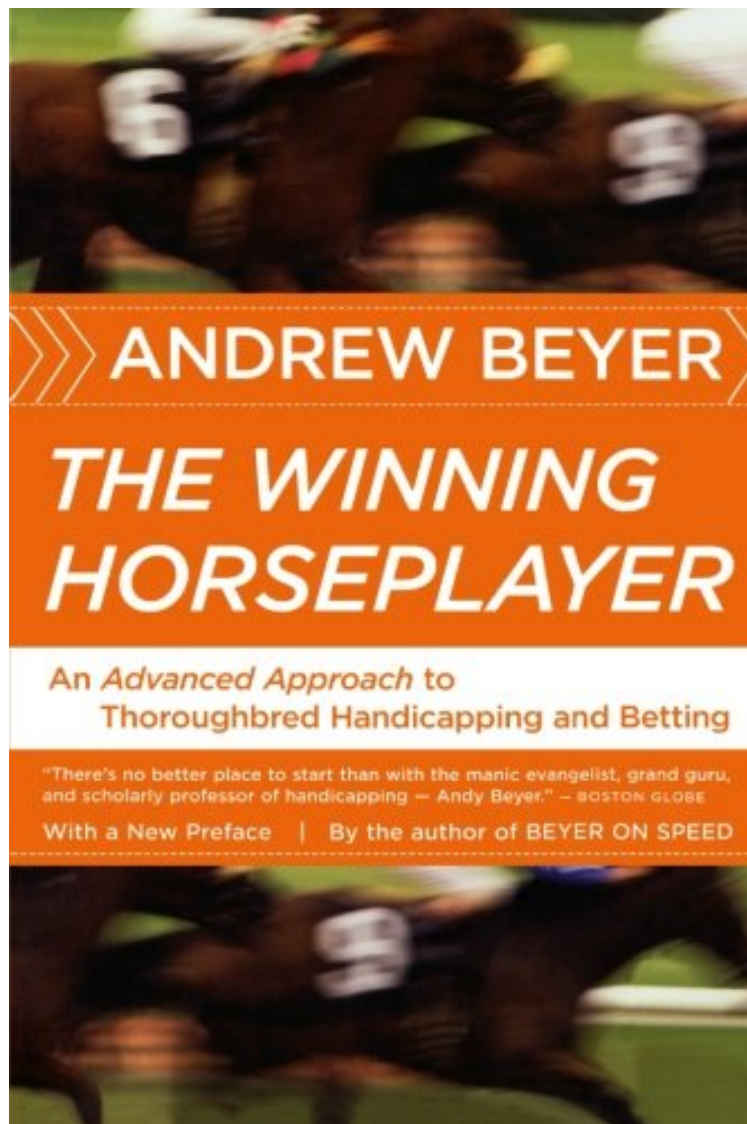

I've read each of Beyer's books and while he may not be the best handicapper he certainly is the best writer in the horse racing world. If I'm not mistaken he studied English Romance at Harvard and clearly took with him the skills to entertain a reader---no others even come close on the subject.
